Dear Sir:

We are now in receipt of full detailed information about members of the Cosack group in Tientsin, China, who are desirous of immigrating to the United States of America, and on per your letter of June 24th, to which we replied on July 25th, when we sent only a few names for your reference, we are herewith sending data about every member of this group. These data give full particulars and we trust comply with your request. The American Consol at Tientsin, China knows about this group, wants to help it in every way and will assist it in every way to leave Tientsin as soon as arrangements can be made.

We are aware of the requirements for visa applicants, but it is not possible to obtain individual affidavits for the group in Tientsin from the Russian community in San Francisco, because practically everyone in the small Russian community here has already supplied affidavits to relations in either China or Europe. Only a few of the group were able to obtain affidavits but the remainder cannot get any. In view of political and military developments in the vicinity of Tientsin to try and wait for visas as immigration quotas permit, would quite likely prove disastrous for these people. However, we, the All Cosacks' Union of San Francisco as a group can and will guarantee that no one of the intended immigrants will become a public charge. It is imperative that they all leave Tientsin as soon as possible, as everyone is anti-occident and they probably will suffer deportation to concentration camps or death, should Tientsin fall into the hands of the Communists, which may happen any day.

Your kind assistance in aiding these people to allow them to come to the United States as political refugees is requested. If not to the U.S. proper, then to Alaska - for individual or group settlement.

We wish to thank you for your help and interest, and trust to hear from you again at an early date.

Studied in Omsk Military School up th third class and in 1922 evacuated with this school to Shanghai, where I continued my studies for a while. Upon receipt of letter from my parents in Harbin to join them, I came to Harbin in 1922, where my father was employed in a private concern.

In 1928 I graduated from a middle school in Harbin and in 1929 entered the Harbin Polytechnical Institute, graduating same in 1933 as Electro-Mechanical Engineer.

1933 - 1934 by Sungari Flour Mill in Harbin as a mechanic.

In 1934 till 1938 was employed by a wood cutting factory in Harbin as a mechanic.

In 1905 I served as an Instructor of young Cossacks. In 1912 I went into the gold mining business and was the owner of several mines. In 1917-1920 revolution I, heading my own Regiment, fought against the communists. In 1922 I returned to Vladivostock where I took an active part in the anti-communist movement and finally left Russian soil for Korea with the remnants of the White Russian Army.

A SHORT BIOGRAPHY OF ARTIST-PAINTER

I was born in 1900 in the city of Irbit, Perm Province, Russia. I graduated from the Irbit High School for boys in 1919. After graduating I was sent to the Front, into the Army of Admiral Kolchak,. I retreated with the White Army up to Chita. In 1920 I was wounded in the skirmish before Chita, and was taken to Harbin, Manchuria, to the Za-Amur Hospital for wounded military personnel.

In 1921 I obtained employment with the Chinese Eastern Railway as engineer, and at the end of the year was released by reason of their cutting down their staff.

From 1922 - 1923 I lived at the Eastern Railway station Handaojdze and by the end of 1923 I left for Harbin.

In 1924 I was trapping for squirrel for commercial purposes in the Hingan Mountains along the West Section of the Chinese Eastern Railway, station Irikhte, junction Unur. In 1925 I returned to Harbin and obtained a position of "Educator" in the "Russian House" of the Brotherhood of Iver. Having received orders in my own special line of Artist-painter, I left that position, and from 1925 to 1935 I lived in Harbin fulfilling various orders for paintings which paid for my existence.

In 1935 I received an offer from Architect U. V. Smirnoff and painter A. D. Sofronoff to go the Tsingtao, China, where there was work to be done in my line of business.

from 1935 to 1939 I remained in Tsingtao. I was there during the Incident of 1937 when I was guard of the Lumber Co. there. In 1940 I accepted the offer of artist I. A. Pikulevich to come to peking, in order to fulfill an order for 100 paintings of all the famous views of peking and vicinity, for the Chinese Government. I have painted altogether 50 canvases in oils, of which i have sketches in water coulurs, which were the basis of the oil paintings. I am at the moment still a resident of Peking, and am in the employ of the Peiping Headquarters Group of the U.S. Army the U. S. Army repair Shop, Mei Char Hutung, as painter.

On the 15th of November 1918 married Zinaida Gavrelovna, nee Jelkina, daughter of a cossack of Siberian Cossack's Army, and have now a son, George, born in Chita, Russia, on the 15th of September 1919.

I received education in a Russian High School for boys in the town of Irkutsk and in 1914 entered a military school, which i graduated in the rank of warrant officer. On the 20th of March I was sent to the front line with the assignment of a company commander to the 16th Siberian Infantry Regiment,. Ther I remained till the year 1917, when I was compelled to seek refuge in Chita immediately after the outbreak of the revolution. From March 1917 I was in command of the 16th separate Cycle Company.

During the war I was wounded six times, but have managed to save only two of the certificates, I have the awards of the Order of St. Prince Vladimir of 4th degree, with swords and rebbons, the Order of St. Anna 4th degree, for bravery, Order of St. Anna 3rd degree, with swords and rëbbon Order of St. Anna 2nd degree, with swords, Order of St. Stanislav 3rd degree, with swords and reibbons, and order of St. Stanislav of 2nd degree with swords.

I, the undersigned, Herman Ilyich OVSIANNIKOFF, Russian Emigrant, was born on the 20th of June 1895 in Moskow. There I grew up and attended school until I received my graduation from the Institute of Agriculture and Economy of that City. My father was a prominent and well known business man of Moskow.

After graduation, in Moskow, I organized my own business firm, known by the name of "Trading House H.Ovsiannikoff & Co" with Head Office in Moskow and Branch Office in Perm, in Archangelsk and in Kharkoff. We were merchants, constructors and contractors for the Russian Government Railways.

In Perm we were also the exclusive contractors of the Government Arsenal; in Archangelsk, besides being the contractors for the Murmansk Railway my firm also constructed dwellings for the Railway employees. Kharkoff branch were contractors for the Northern-Don Railway and were also connected with the "Shapara" a Metalurgic Factory, manufacturing bolts, rivets, nails, a.s.o. for the same Railway, also for Perm, Archangelsk and Murmansk.

In addition to above, at the beginning of the Great War my firm undertook the wholesale provisioning of the Russian Army.

To supply the Army with vegetables we bought interests in a large farm on the outskirts of Perm for the growing and salting of huge quantities of cabbages, while in the city of Perm itself we operated a factory for the manufacturing of wooden casks and barrels used for the packing of salted meats and vegetables. I am in a position to produce documents in support of the foregoing statements.

In consequence of the Russian Revolution of October my whole business organisation ceased to exist and I myself had to flee elsewhere. I settled in Siberia where I started working for the new Government of Omsk/1918-19 Documents in my possession prove the above.


